
Class of 1985 Class Agent Letter November 2024

News from Wabash:

- On August 17, 2024, President Scott Feller rang in 267 members of the Class of 2028 to the ranks of Wabash men, and all of them probably are better students than I was. They came from 18 states and 14 countries. Importantly, 47 of the freshmen were Wabash Legacies! If you know a curious and bright high school student, please refer him online at: wabash.edu/refer.
- The official total enrollment this semester is 882 students. This was helped by an excellent freshman-to-sophomore retention rate of 93%. Given the tough times that many small colleges around the country are having staying open, our strong retention rate is critical to our long-term success.
- The 130th Monon Bell game is this Saturday (November 16) in Greencastle at 1:07 EST. Both teams are undefeated in conference so far this year, so the winner will be the NCAC champ and advance into the NCAA D3 playoffs. In true W.A.F. fashion, our team came from behind against both Denison and Wittenberg the past couple weeks. All the tickets are sold, but the game will be streamed live on the ISC Network (https://www.iscsportsnetwork.com/). The Wabash College Video Network will also broadcast the ISC Network feed. - As I mentioned in my April letter, Wabash is replacing the Sparks Center with a new "Campus Center." The project was delayed, but here is an update from the Alumni Office:

On Monday [Nov. 11], the campus transitioned from Sparks over to the temporary dining facility, which has already met with a very positive reaction from student, faculty, staff, and visiting diners. Dubbed "Grub Hollow," a dozen mobile units, each 12 feet wide by 60 feet long, have been connected on one set of the outdoor tennis courts beside the Collett Tennis Center.

Demolition of Sparks and construction of the new Community Center has been delayed because of a unique funding opportunity through a USDA Rural Development Loan. With a 40-year fixed rate, the loan will help fund the Community Center and infrastructure improvements. Wabash has filed the paperwork and successfully met each step. We're waiting to hear final word before we put shovels in dirt.
